

REVIEW AND UPDATE OF CITY OF SUFFOLK'S PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN

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BACKGROUND

It's a good time to be in Suffolk. This motto indicates the confidence with which the City is changing, growing, and adapting to new opportunities. Areas of rural landscape are being transformed into high technology centers. The historic downtown core is vibrant once again. Yet more than 75% of the City remains predominately agricultural. Change is occurring and the City is determined to manage and guide it to enhance the quality of its citizens' lives.

Comprehensive planning is central to the City's past success and to its future prosperity. The 2026 Comprehensive Plan has been the City's primary planning document, establishing the foundations for the City's current growth management strategy, and has served the City well after its adoption in April 2006. The last Parks and Recreation Master Plan was updated in 2000.

The City of Suffolk, Virginia is located in Southeast Virginia in the geographic center of the Hampton Roads area. The City of Suffolk is large, consisting of approximately 430 square miles; and is bounded by the James River (and the City of Newport News) to the north, the Cities of Portsmouth and Chesapeake to the east, Isle of Wight and Southampton Counties to the west and the State of North Carolina to the south.

The City of Suffolk is diverse geographically with a variety of development patterns as a result of being the merged political jurisdiction of a rural county and small core city in 1974; and today includes urban, suburban and rural development patterns. As a result of the City's location within the Hampton Roads Metropolitan Area, the extremely large size of the City, and the availability of developable lands, the City continues to face the pressures of rapid growth and its associated effects.

The City of Suffolk's population has grown tremendously over the past 20 years. Between 1990 and 2000 the population of Suffolk increased by 22.1% from 52,143 to 63,677. In comparison, during the same period the population of the Hampton Roads Metropolitan Region grew by 8.8%. Between 2000 and 2010, the City's population continued to grow, increasing by 20,908 to 84,585, a 32.83% increase. In 2010 there were 33,035 residential housing units within Suffolk. During this same period the City also experienced healthy commercial and industrial development.

PURPOSE

The City of Suffolk, Virginia is requesting sealed proposals from qualified individuals and firms to provide consulting services for the Review and Update of the Parks and Recreation Master Plan as detailed herein. In general, the scope of work shall include the review and update of general background and existing conditions, data, and information; the review, modification and expansion of current plan elements; the preparation of new plan elements, and the preparation of appropriate strategies implementing the completed plan and elements contained therein.

The final Scope of Services, as negotiated, shall be in substantial accordance with the proposed Scope of Services to follow. The contract shall include a schedule of deliverables and completion dates. The City reserves the right to negotiate for additional services which may be required during the contract period.

Qualified firms shall have a thorough understanding and comprehension of current parks and recreation master planning and innovative parks and recreation design and practices, community survey techniques, and public participation strategies.

TERM OF AGREEMENT

Services shall commence upon conveyance of a fully executed AGREEMENT to the APPLICANT. The term of this agreement shall be from the date of the agreement for one year, with three renewals (option of the City's), in one year increments, or when all Task Orders for the project have been completed.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

This Scope of Services format is offered to simplify the offeror's task and to provide a consistent format to help the Comprehensive Recreation Master Plan Selection Committee compare qualification submittals. The following is a breakdown of the services requested by the City of Suffolk for planning services:

Public Participation - The purpose of this plan should be to raise citizen awareness and design a collaborative process. The plan shall provide detailed communication goals, methods, measurable objectives, strategies, tactics, activities, timelines, responsibilities, evaluation, and an estimated budget. The plan should use best practice formats, methods, and techniques that will explain, defend, and address how the plan will yield credible results with data that stands up to scientific and industry practices.

Requirements of the plan -This plan must include:

- A. Incorporation of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission as a master plan steering committee including one meeting.
- B. Assist staff with development of a needs analysis to evaluate resident and visitor perceptions on recreation strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats (SWOT Analysis).
- C. A stakeholder meeting to discuss specific recreational needs as well as the overall City's parks and recreation system.
- D. Three (3) City-wide open house meetings with a printed agenda, power point presentation, handouts, displays and materials, and assume leadership role in all meetings:
- E. First internal progress report to discuss current status, deficiencies, and directions.
- F. Second internal progress report to discuss a plan, draft, funding, and priorities.
- G. A public hearing before the City Council for acceptance of the Comprehensive Recreation Master Plan.
- H. The Planning Period for the Comprehensive Master Plan shall cover the next 15 years.

Components of the Comprehensive Master Plan – The plan must include the following components:

- A. Review of existing documents, plans, and studies regarding services provided by the Parks and Recreation Department including the last Parks Master Plan, City's Comprehensive Plan, Healthy People Healthy Suffolk Plan, Virginia Outdoor Plan and Hampton Roads Transportation Plan.
- B. The necessary demographic, market, and geographical information and analysis to adequately measure societal and local trends and community demographics relating to participation and interest in recreation facilities and programs.
- C. A GIS based reporting system to assist the Parks and Recreation staff with inventory of existing parks, facilities, recreation centers, trails, programs and services. Inventory should include assistance with mapping and reporting. This inventory will also include alternative providers such as schools, other governmental agencies, for-profit and not-for-profit providers, to aid in the understanding where there are overlapping areas, facilities, programs and services or gaps in such.
- D. A historical, cultural and natural resource management plan(s). Including an inventory of historical, cultural and natural resources and recommendations for how these will be managed. This inventory will be used to develop policy and procedures to address environmentally unique areas, wetlands, riverbanks, and woodlands valuable for erosion control, nature study, wildlife habitat, water supply reservoirs and water recharge areas. Critical elements include species selection for trees and shrubs, integrated pest management, knowledge of plant succession communities, and woodland ecology. It will also be used to establish an environmental sustainability policy that

addresses energy conservation, environmentally preferable purchasing, water conservation/quality protection and sustainable design/construction of buildings and facilities.

- E. Master Plan Recommendations for future development and operation of Suffolk Parks and Recreation based on standards and trends from state and national reports and publications. Recommendation should include service delivery, facility and park development, master trail plan with both greenways and blueways and projected capital improvement program costs.
- F. A 3 to 5 year strategic plan based on findings in the Master Plan process and organized to follow the National Recreation and Parks Association priorities of Conservation Health and Wellness and Social Equity. The plan shall contain a framework for organizational progress to achieve results. The goals and objects of the plan shall be measurable to demonstrate progress and results. The strategic plan shall support the priorities and initiatives of the whole organization.

City Review

The consultant who is awarded the contract shall submit a digital (Acrobat format) copy of the Comprehensive Recreation Master Plan and meet with City staff to review draft documents to ensure that the project is consistent with the scope of services.

Prepare Final Suffolk Comprehensive Recreation Master Plan

- A. After open houses and final review of draft Comprehensive Recreation Master plan documents by the staff and the steering committee, the Comprehensive Recreation Master Plan shall be presented by staff for approval by the City Council.
- B. The Suffolk Comprehensive Recreation Master Plan shall be a bound document with reduced maps contained within the document and an Acrobat file with an executable table of contents suitable for digital distribution.

Progress Reporting

The consultant shall:

- a) Communicate at least monthly with Parks and Recreation staff to summarize activities, progress, and obstacles;
- b) Meet with the Parks and Recreation staff prior to scheduled open houses and public hearings or meetings;
- c) Staff one (1) Steering Committee Meeting, One (1) Stakeholder meeting and three (3) Open House meetings;
- d) Provide briefings to the Parks and Recreation staff via e-mail with monthly summaries of activities, progress, and obstacles;

PROPOSAL PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

General Proposal Requirements:

- A. RFP Response: In accordance with the specifications herein, the proposals shall provide a straight forward, concise delineation of capabilities, experience, and approach to the task outlined in this request. The proposals shall be limited to approximately 30 pages, inclusive of all submitted materials, and be in .pdf format. No zip files shall be used. Firms are specifically requested to address the following:
- B. Firm organization, local presence, size, history, range of experience, interest in the contract.
- C. Organizational chart of key personnel.
- D. Resumes of key personnel.
- E. Project summaries, including reference contact information, for five (5) similar contracts that demonstrate the project team's experience.
- F. Proposed approach to this work,
- G. Proposed fees /expenses to perform the study.
- H. Offer must provide certification that no company member has affiliation with or holds interest in any organization or contracting firm that would participate in the installation of the work contracted for.

SUBMITTALS:

The City of Suffolk shall not be responsible for any expense incurred by the firm in preparing and submitting a proposal or expenses incurred related to subsequent inquires/interviews and contract negotiations. All proposals submitted shall become property of the City of Suffolk. Proposals must be signed by the principal of the firm authorized to negotiate and contract for the work. Proposals are to be delivered as an electronic document. The subject line shall identify the project and closing date. Only electronic documents sent or delivered as indicated within this RFP shall be considered. Proposals must be received by the Purchasing Department no later than 5:00 p.m. local time, on the date specified for receipt of proposals

The intent of using electronic submissions is to reduce the use of paper, and provide a faster, more economical approach while permitting the offeror to describe their skills, education, experience, pricing, and ingenuity, that would qualify them to be selected for interviews. Offerors so selected will be allowed to make a formal presentation of their qualifications and job approach, and may be selected for final negotiations of a contract. Therefore, care should be given to address the issues relating to the criteria to follow.

PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

Trade secrets or proprietary information submitted by an offeror in connection with this solicitation shall not be subject to disclosure under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act; however, the offeror must invoke the protections of this section prior to or upon submission of the data or other materials, and must clearly identify the data or other materials to be protected and state the reasons why protection is necessary. Offerors shall not mark sections of their proposal as proprietary if they are to be part of the basis of an award of the contract or are otherwise of a "Material" nature. Any propriety information must be listed on the attached "Proprietary/confidential Information Identification" form and

submitted with the proposal.

1. Addendum to Request for Proposal:

It is the responsibility of the Offeror to understand and clarify any and all requirements of the Request for Proposal. Inquiries may be made in writing only to the Contract Officer indicated on the cover of this RFP. Only the questions, revisions and amendments, if any, acknowledged by addenda will be binding upon the City. Oral and other interpretations or clarifications shall be without legal effect.

The City may revise, amend or cancel the RFP prior to the date set for receipt of proposals; the opening date may be postponed if deemed necessary. Such action will be by Addenda All addenda will be published on the Purchasing Division's website: http://www.suffolkva.us/bids/bid_search_all.jsp It is the responsibility of the Offeror to check the website prior to submitting their proposals.

2. Oral Presentation:

Firms which submit a response to this RFP may be required to make an oral presentation to key staff personnel. The City reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted and to request additional information from one or more applicants. The City may cancel the Request for Proposals or reject proposals at any time prior to award and is not required to furnish a statement of reason (Section 2.2-4359, Code of Virginia).

EVALUATION CRITERIA AND AWARD PROCESS

The City's Evaluation Committee shall review each proposal and make a selection of proposals that will be considered further. This selection shall be made for each proposal on the basis of the criteria listed below. Each criterion will be evaluated based upon the strengths and weaknesses of the submittal or subsequent information gained in the process. They are listed in the order of importance.

- a. Qualifications, credentials, and related experience of the Offeror's key personnel.
- b. Established working relationships as a project team on similar jobs
- c. Quality of prior work, including design efficiencies, timeliness and cost control.
- d. Adequacy and availability and support resources
- e. Approach to the task/operational plan.
- f. Reasonableness of proposed schedule;
- g. Expected cost of the overall project.
- h. Overall quality and completeness of proposal based on the submittal requirements

The procurement of these services shall be in accordance with procedures of the Virginia Public Procurement Act, Competitive Negotiation for other than professional services.

Once each member of the Evaluation Committee has read and considered each proposal against the criteria, a consensus of the Committee shall be reached establishing a ranking the proposals. This ranking shall be used to select firms for further consideration—the short-list. At this point, the Evaluation Committee will conduct interviews and negotiations with two or more of the top ranked firms.

After interviews and negotiations have been conducted with each of the selected Offerors, the City shall select the proposal which, in its sole opinion, is in the best interest of the City and make an award to that firm. Should the City determine, in its sole discretion, that only one offeror is qualified, or that one offeror is clearly more highly qualified than the other under consideration, a contract may be negotiated and awarded to that offeror. The file will show the Committee's perception of the strengths and weaknesses of each proposal received as basis for selection.

The successful firm will be expected to enter into a contract with the City of Suffolk based upon their submittal, any additional negotiated terms, and best and final pricing. The successful firm shall execute and return the contract documents to the City within ten (10) days of receipt.

CONDITIONS AND INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Use of Form:** All proposals should be submitted in electronic (.pdf) format in accordance with this form. The offeror may attach/scan other information as required to the electronic document that will be made a part of the proposal. Electronic submittals on CD, DVD, memory sticks, or other electronic media will be accepted if delivered prior to the closing time. The preferred method is by an attachment to an email addressed to: proposals@suffolkva.us. The City's published Conditions and Instructions shall supersede any additional writings submitted with the proposal. Such writings shall be clearly marked and noted as an exception.
2. **Submittals:** Except as noted above, all proposals shall be sent as an attachment to email to: proposals@suffolkva.us. The subject line must show the proposal number and name. This form shall be included as part of your submittal; else, your response may be considered 'non-responsive.'
3. **Late Proposals:** Proposals and amendments thereto, if received by Purchasing after the date and time specified, will not be considered. It will be the responsibility of the offeror to see that their proposal is received by Purchasing as specified. There will be no exceptions. Electronic proposals show the date and time sent. This must be prior to the closing date published on the front cover.
4. **City Hall Closure:** Should the City's electronic networks connectivity prevent receipt of proposals at the time of the scheduled proposal closing, the proposals will be accepted and opened on the next business day of the City, at the original scheduled hour, or as soon as connectivity is restored during normal business hours.
5. **Offer/Acceptance:** Each proposal is received with the understanding that the acceptance in writing by the City of the offer to furnish any or all of the goods and/or services described therein, shall constitute a contract between the offeror and the City, which shall bind the offeror to furnish and deliver the goods and/or services quoted at the prices stated and in accordance with the conditions of the accepted proposal; and the City on its part to order from such offeror, except for causes beyond reasonable control; and pay for, at the agreed prices, all goods and/or services specified and delivered.
6. **Withdrawal of Proposals:** Proposals may be withdrawn (cancelled) any time prior to the closing time and date. Withdrawal of proposals may be accomplished by submitting such request in writing on the issuing company's letterhead either by email, in person, or by certified mail.
7. **Addenda:** If issued, addenda to this solicitation will be posted on the Purchasing website (<http://www.suffolkva.us/proposals/index.jsp>). It is the offeror's responsibility to check the website or contact the Purchasing Division prior to the submittal deadline to ensure that the offeror has a complete, up-to-date package. Acknowledgement of all issued Addenda shall be indicated on the proposal form in the appropriate spaces.
8. **Award:** Award will be made to the offer considered by the City's sole determination after following the procedure outlined herein. The process used for this solicitation shall be Competitive Negotiation for Professional Services as outlined in the Virginia Public Procurement Act.
9. **Announcements:** Upon the award or the announcement of the decision to award a contract, the City will publicly post such notice on the bulletin board located outside of the Purchasing Division and on the City's web site: (http://www.suffolkva.us/proposals/proposal_search_awarded.jsp)
10. **City's Rights:** The City reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, and to waive any informality if it is determined to be in the best interest of the City.
11. **Delivery:** The time of delivery of services must be stated in definite terms. If time of delivery for different goods and/or services varies, the offeror shall so state.
12. **Samples:** Samples, when requested, must be furnished free of expense, and upon request, if not destroyed, will

be returned at the offeror's risk and expense.

13. **Silence of Specifications:** The apparent silence of these specifications and any supplemental specifications as to any detail or the omission from the specifications of a detailed description concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail and correct type, size and design are to be used. All interpretations of these specifications shall be made on the basis of this statement.
14. **Capacity of Offeror:** All proposals must be signed by a responsible officer or employee having the authority to bind the firm in contract. The offeror agrees that its contract performance shall be in strict conformance with the contract documents.
15. **Rights to Damages:** By signing this proposal, the offeror assigns to the City any and all rights that it may have under the antitrust laws of the United States and the Commonwealth of Virginia in any way arising from or pertaining to this proposal. This provision is remedial in nature and is to be liberally construed by any court in favor of the City.
16. **Anti-collusion:** The offeror certifies by signing this Request for Proposals that this proposal is made without prior understanding, agreement, or accord with any other person or firm submitting a proposal for the same goods and/or services and that this proposal is in all respects bona fide, fair, and not the result of any act of fraud or collusion with another person or firm engaged in the same line of business or commerce. Any false statement hereunder may constitute a felony and can result in a fine and imprisonment, as well as civil damages. Should sub-Consultant s or sub consultants have interest in multiple submittals, this clause does not apply except when an act of collusion or fraud.
17. **Indemnification:** The Consultant shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, and the City's employees, agents, and volunteers, harmless, from and against any and all damage claim, liability, cost, or expense (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and court costs) of every kind and nature (including, without limitation, those arising from any injury or damage to any person, property or business) incurred by or claimed against the Consultant , its employees, agents, and volunteers, or incurred by or claimed against the City, the City's employees, agents, and volunteers, arising out of, or in connection with, the performance of all services hereunder by the Consultant . This indemnification and hold harmless includes, but is not limited to, any financial or other loss including, but not limited to, any adverse regulatory, agency or administrative sanction or civil penalties, incurred by the City due to the negligent, fraudulent or criminal acts of the Consultant or any of the Consultant's officers, shareholders, employees, agents, Consultant s, sub-Consultant s, or any other person or entity acting on behalf of the Contractor. Unless otherwise provided by law, the Contractor indemnification obligations hereunder shall not be limited in any way by the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for the Contractor under worker's compensation acts, disability benefit acts, other employee benefit acts, or benefits payable under any insurance policy. This paragraph shall survive the termination of the contract including any renewal or extension thereof.
18. **Copyright Protection:** The Contractor agrees to defend and save the City, its agents, officials, and employees, harmless from liability of any nature or kind, for use of any copyright, composition, secret process, patented or unpatented invention, articles or appliances furnished or used in the performance of the contract, or which the Contractor is not the patentee, assignee, or licensee, to the same extent as provided in the above paragraph.
19. **Laws, Regulations:** The Contractor shall keep fully informed of all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances and regulations that in any manner affect the conduct of the work. The Contractor shall at all times observe and comply with all such laws, ordinances and regulations.
20. **Alien employment:** The Contractor certifies that he does not and shall not during the performance of the contract for goods and services in the Commonwealth, knowingly employ unauthorized aliens as defined in the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as amended.
21. **SCC Authorization:** All offerors authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth pursuant to Title 13.1 or

Title 50, as amended, shall include the identification number issued to it by the State Corporation Commission. Any offeror that is not required to be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth as a foreign business entity under Title 13.1 or Title 50, as amended, or as otherwise required by law shall include in its proposal or proposal a statement describing why the offeror or offeror is not required to be so authorized.

SCC Number, or Statement: _____

Any business entity that enters into a contract with a public body pursuant to this chapter shall not allow its existence to lapse or its certificate of authority or registration to transact business in the Commonwealth, if so required under Title 13.1, or Title 50, as amended, to be revoked or cancelled at any time during the term of the contract. The City may void any contract with a business entity if the business entity fails to remain in compliance with the provisions of this section.

22. **Default:** In event of default by the Contractor, the City reserves the right to procure the goods and/or services from other sources, and hold the Contractor liable for any excess cost occasioned thereby. Such actions taken by the City shall not release the contractor from additional remedies that may be allowed by law.
23. **Availability of Funds:** When a contract resulting from this solicitation involves multiple fiscal periods, such contract shall be deemed in force only to the extent of appropriations available to each department for the purchase of such goods and/or services. The City's extended obligations on those contracts that envision extended funding through successive fiscal periods shall be contingent upon actual appropriations for the following years.
24. **Appeals Procedure:** Upon your request, administrative appeals information will be provided that shall be used for hearing protests of a decision to award, or an award, appeals from refusal to allow withdrawal of proposals, appeals from disqualification, appeals for debarment or suspension, or determination of non-responsibility and appeals from decision or disputes arising during the performance of a contract. To be timely all appeals shall be made within the time periods set forth by the Virginia Public Procurement Act, §2.2-4357, et seq. Contact the buyer at once for assistance.
25. **Faith-based Organizations:** The City of Suffolk does not discriminate against faith-based organizations.
26. **Anti-Discrimination:** By submitting their proposals, offerors certify to the City that they will conform to the provisions of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Contracting Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable, the Virginians with Disabilities Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act and 2.2-4311 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (VPPA). If the award is made to a faith-based organization, the organization shall not discriminate against any recipient of goods, services, or disbursements made pursuant to the contract on the basis of the recipient's religion, religious belief, refusal to participate in a religious practice, or on the basis of race, age, color, gender or national origin and shall be subject to the same rules as other organizations that contract with public bodies to account for the use of the funds provided; however, if the faith-based organization segregates public funds into separate accounts, only the accounts and programs funded with public funds shall be subject to audit by the public body. (Code of Virginia 2.2.4343.1E).

In every contract over \$10,000 shall include the following provisions:

1. During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:
 1. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, service disabled veterans or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment, except where there is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

2. The Contractor, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, will state that such Contractor is an equal opportunity employer.
3. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting these requirements.

2. The Contractor will include the provisions of Section a, b, and c above in every subcontract or purchase order over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

27. **Drug-Free Workplace:** During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees to (1) provide a drug-free workplace for the Contractor's employees; (2) post in conspicuous place, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the Consultant 's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (3) state in all solicitation or advertisement for employees placed by or on behalf of the Consultant that the Consultant maintains a drug-free workplace; and (4) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each sub-consultant or vendor.

For the purposes of this section, "drug-free workplace" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a Consultant , the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of any controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the contract.

28. **Assignment of Contract:** A contract shall not be assignable by the Consultant in whole or in part without the written consent of the City.

29. **Independent Consultant :** The Consultant and any employees, agents, or other persons or entities acting on behalf of the Consultant shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers, employees, or agents of the City.

30. **Scheduling and Delays:** The parties to any contract resultant of this solicitation acknowledge that all or part of the work to be performed hereunder may be delayed and extended at the option of the City. Such delays may be caused by delays, denials and modifications of the various state or federal permits, or for other reasons. The City shall not be required to pay any of the Consultant's direct or indirect costs, or claims for compensation, extended overhead, or other damage or consequential damages arising out of or related to any delays or interruptions required or ordered by the City. If the City delays the project for any reason for a continuous period of ninety (90) days or more, the City and Consultant will negotiate a mutually agreeable adjustment to the Consultant 's award amount. Notwithstanding the above, in construction contracts, to the extent that an unreasonable delay is caused by the act or omissions of the City due to causes within the City's control, the above waiver or release shall not apply.

31. **Governing Law:** This Agreement is made, entered into, and shall be performed in the City of Suffolk, Virginia, and shall be governed by the applicable laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia without regard to its conflict of law rules. In the event of litigation concerning this Agreement, the parties agree to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Circuit Court of the City of Suffolk, Virginia; however, in the event that the federal court has jurisdiction over the matter, then the parties agree to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Norfolk Division.

The Consultant shall not cause a delay in services because of the pending or during litigation proceedings, except with the express, written consent of the City or written instruction/order from the Court.

32. **Severability:** If any provision of a contract resulting from this solicitation, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall to any extent be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this contract, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those which it is invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected hereby, and each provision of this contract shall be valid and enforced to the full extent

permitted by law.

33. **Termination for Convenience:** The City may at any time, and for any reason, terminate this Contract by written notice to Consultant specifying the termination date, which shall be not less than thirty (30) days from the date such notice is mailed.

Notice shall be given to Consultant by certified mail/return receipt requested at the address set forth in Consultant's Proposal or as provided in this Contract. In the event of such termination, Consultant shall be paid such amount as shall compensate Consultant for the work satisfactorily completed, and accepted by the City, at the time of termination. If the City terminates this Contract, Consultant shall withdraw its personnel and equipment, cease performance of any further work under this Contract, and turn over to the City any work completed or in process for which payment has been made.

34. **Termination for Cause:** In the event that Consultant shall for any reason or through any cause be in default of the terms of this Contract, the City may give Consultant written notice of such default by certified mail/return receipt requested at the address set forth in Consultant's Proposal/ or as provided in this Contract.

Unless otherwise provided, Consultant shall have ten (10) days from the date such notice is mailed in which to cure the default. Upon failure of Consultant to cure the default, the City may immediately cancel and terminate this Contract as of the mailing date of the default notice.

Upon termination, Consultant shall withdraw its personnel and equipment, cease performance of any further work under the Contract, and turn over to the City any work in process for which payment has been made. In the event of violations of law, safety or health standards and regulations, this Contract may be immediately cancelled and terminated by the City and provisions herein with respect to opportunity to cure default shall not be applicable.

35. **Contact Prohibition:** Direct contact with City departments other than Purchasing, on the subject of this proposal is expressly forbidden except with the foreknowledge and permission of the Contract Officer. Violation may result in a determination that your firm is ineligible for an award.

All questions shall be in writing to the Contract Officer shown on the title page of the proposal. The respondents to this RFP shall not contact, either directly or indirectly, any other employee or agent of the City regarding this RFP. This prohibition shall also extend to the Suffolk City Council and locally elected officials. Any such unauthorized contact may disqualify the offeror from this procurement.

36. **Additional Conditions:** The Conditions and Instructions in this solicitation are intended to apply to the resulting contract and shall supersede any conflicting terms offered. Any additional conditions a offeror intends be considered must be submitted with the proposal and noted as an exception. Such exceptions may result in a finding that the submittal is 'non-responsive' to the proposal, negating possibility of an award to that offeror. Contractual documents submitted by the successful firm after an award will not be accepted.

37. **Consultant Failure to Perform:** Failure of the Consultant to perform the contract by reason of the City's non-acceptance of additional conditions submitted after the award shall result in termination of the contract by the City, and may result in debarment of the Consultant for a period of up to three (3) years. Termination and /or debarment of the Consultant shall not constitute a waiver by the City of any other rights or remedies available to the City by law or contract.

38. **Conflict:** In the event of a conflict between the contract documents, including these Conditions and Instructions, the contract documents shall control.

39. **Records and Inspection:** The Consultant shall maintain full and accurate records with respect to all matters covered under this contract, including, without limitation, accounting records, written policies, procedures, time records, telephone records, and any other supporting evidence used to memorialize, reflect, and substantiate charges or fees related to this contract. The Consultant's records shall be open to inspection and subject to audit

and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by the City and its employees, agents or authorized representatives after giving at least three (3) days notice to the Consultant by the City. The City shall have access to such records from the effective date of this contract, for the duration of the contract, and for five (5) years after the date of final payment by the City to the Consultant pursuant to this contract or any renewal or extension of this contract. The City's employees, agents or authorized representatives shall have access to the Consultant's facilities, shall have access to all necessary records and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space, in order to conduct audits.

40. **Rights and Remedies Not Waived:** In no event shall the making by the City of any payment to the Consultant, or the waiver by the City of any provision under this contract including any obligation of the Consultant, constitute or be construed as a waiver by the City of any other provision, obligation, breach of covenant, or any default which may exist under this contract on the part of the Consultant, and the making of any such payment by the City while any such breach or default exists shall not impair or prejudice any right or remedies available to the City.
41. **Entire Agreement:** An resultant contract and any additional or supplementary documents incorporated herein by reference contain all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto, and no other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this contract or any part thereof shall have any validity or bind any of the parties hereto. The contract shall not be modified, altered, changed or amended unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
42. **Conflicts of Interests:** Consultant shall not accept or receive commissions or other payments from third parties for soliciting, negotiating, procuring, or effecting insurance on behalf of the City. The City may not procure supplies, equipment, materials or other goods from a consultant on the same project.
43. **Responsibility of Consultant:** The Consultant shall, without additional costs or fee to the City, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in his performance. Neither the City's review, approval or acceptance of, nor payment for any of the services required under this Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of rights by the City, and the Consultant shall remain liable to the City for all costs which are incurred by the City as a result of the Consultant's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this Agreement.
44. **Changes and Additions:** It shall be the responsibility of the Consultant to notify the City, in writing, of any necessary modifications or additions in the Scope of this Agreement. Compensation for changes or additions in the Scope of this Agreement will be negotiated and approved by the City, in writing.

It is understood and agreed to by both the City and the Consultant that such modifications or additions to this Agreement shall be made only by the full execution of the City's standard Agreement change order form. Furthermore, it is understood and agreed by both parties that any work done by the Consultant on such modification or addition to this Agreement prior to the City's execution of its standard Agreement change order form shall be at the total risk of the Consultant and said work may not be compensated by the City.
45. **Exemption from Taxes:** The City is exempt from State Sales Tax and Federal Excise Tax. Tax Exemption Certificate indicating the City's tax exempt status will be furnished by the City of Suffolk upon request.
46. **Debarment Status:** By submitting a proposal, proposers certify that they are not currently debarred by the Commonwealth of Virginia from submitting proposals or proposals on contracts for the type of goods and/or services covered by this solicitation, nor are they an agent of any person or entity that is currently so debarred.
47. **Safety:** All Consultants and sub-consultants performing services for the City are required and shall comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), State and City Safety and Occupational Health Standards and any other applicable rules and regulations. Also all Consultants and sub-consultants shall be held responsible for the safety of their employees and any unsafe acts or conditions that may cause injury or damage to any persons or property within and around the work site area under this contract.

48. **License Requirement:** All firms doing business in the City of Suffolk are required to be licensed in accordance with the City of Suffolk business license ordinance. Wholesale and retail merchants without a business location in the City of Suffolk are exempt from this requirement. Any questions concerning business licenses should be directed to the Commissioner of the Revenue's Office, telephone (757) 514-4260.
49. **Consultant's Form:** In cases where the City may accept the Consultant's form agreement, whereas certain standard clauses that may appear in the Consultant's form agreement cannot be accepted by the City, and in consideration of the convenience of using that form, and this form, without the necessity of negotiating a separate contract document, the parties hereto specifically agree that, notwithstanding any provisions appearing in the attached Consultant's form contract, the City's contract addendum shall prevail over the terms of the Consultant's agreement in the event of a conflict.
50. **Offeror's Qualifications:** Only proposals from established Consultants for work similar in scope to work herein shall be considered; the City reserves the right to request specific reference information prior to award. Offeror shall demonstrate that they have adequate and appropriate manpower, tools and equipment to respond and perform in accordance with the provisions herein. The City may, at its option, disqualify an offeror and reject his proposal for cause. Reasons deemed to be sufficient for this action shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- Evidence of collusion among offeror.
 - Receipt of more than one proposal on any project from an individual, or from a corporation. This restriction does not apply to sub-consultants
 - Default on any previous contract.
 - For unreasonable failure to complete a previous contract within the specified time or for being in arrears on an existing contract without reasonable cause for being in arrears.
 - Inability to perform as revealed by an investigation of the Proposer's financial statement, experience and/or plant and equipment.
 - Consultant does not meet project-specific requirements, as identified in the Contract Documents
51. **Pricing to be F.O.B. Destination – Freight Allowed:** Pricing shall be F.O.B. destination-freight included for all competitive proposals. F.O.B. Destination-Freight Included shall include all shipping costs to the City location(s) at the unit cost. No additional shipping charges shall be allowed.
52. **Contract Quantities:** The quantities specified in the Request for Proposals are estimates only unless otherwise clearly noted, and are given for the information of offeror and for the purpose of proposal evaluation. They do not indicate the actual quantity that will be required, since such volume will depend upon requirements that may develop during the contract period. Quantities shown shall not be construed to represent any amount which the City shall be obligated to purchase under the contract, or relieve the Consultant of his obligation to fill all orders placed by the City, except as clearly noted.
53. **Competition Intended:** It is the City's intent that the Request for Proposals (RFP) permits competition. It shall be the offeror's responsibility to advise the Buyer in writing if any language requirement, specification, etc., or any combination thereof, inadvertently restricts or limits the requirements stated in this RFP to a single source. Such notification must be received by the Contract Officer prior to the date set for proposals to close.
54. **Insurance:** The successful offeror shall procure, maintain, and provide proof of, insurance coverage for injuries to persons and/or property damage as may arise from or in conjunction with, the work performed on behalf of the City by the offeror, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors. Proof of coverage as contained herein shall be submitted fifteen (15) days prior to the commencement of work and such coverage shall be maintained by the offeror for the duration of the contract period; for occurrence policies. Claims made policies must be in force or that coverage purchased for three (3) years after contract completion date.

1. The successful offeror shall provide the City with an Errors and Omissions Liability Policy (E&O Policy). The policy shall cover the City for all sources of liability which would be covered by the latest edition of the standard Errors and Omissions Liability Coverage Form, as filed for use in the Commonwealth of Virginia by the Insurance Services Office, without the attachment of restrictive endorsements.

2. The City policy shall be endorsed to include the City's officials, officers, agents and employees as insured. The E&O Policy shall include the successful offeror and the offeror's subcontractors of every tier as the offeror designated in the declarations.

3. The minimum E&O Policy limits to be provided by the successful offeror (inclusive of any amounts provided by an umbrella or excess policy) shall be \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury liability and property damage liability. The limits afforded by the E&O Policy (or umbrella or excess policy with respect to it) shall apply only to the City and City's officials, officers, agents and employees and only to claims arising out of or in connection with the work under this contract.

4. **Notice of Cancellation and/or Restriction** - The policy must be specifically endorsed to provide the City with forty-five (45) days' notice of cancellation, non-renewal, change in coverage, and/or restriction.

a. **Coverage Provisions**

1. All deductibles or self-insured retention shall appear on the certificate(s).

2. The City of Suffolk, its' officers/ officials, employees, agents and volunteers shall be added as "additional insured" as their interests may appear. This provision does not apply to Professional Liability or Workers' Compensation/Employers' Liability.

3. The offeror's insurance shall be primary over any applicable insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City.

7. Failure to comply with any reporting provisions of the policy(s) shall not affect coverage provided the City, its' officers/officials, agents, employees and volunteers.

8. The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the City, its' officers/officials, agents, employees or volunteers for any act, omission or condition of premises which the parties may be held liable by reason of negligence.

9. The offeror shall furnish the City certificates of insurance including endorsements affecting coverage. The certificates are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurance company(s) to bind coverage on its' behalf, if executed by a broker, notarized copy of authorization to bind, or certify coverage must be attached.

10. All insurance shall be placed with insurers maintaining an A.M. Best rating of no less than an A:VII. If A.M. Best rating is less than A:VII, approval must be received from City's Risk Officer.

11. All coverage designated herein shall be as broad as the Insurance Services Office (ISO) forms filed for use with the Commonwealth of Virginia.

55. **Invoicing/ Payment and Interest:** Prior to payment the vendor shall provide their federal employer identification number. Payment to vendor shall be made not more than forty-five (45) days after goods or services are received; or not more the forty-five (45) days after the invoice is rendered, whichever is later.

Unless otherwise provided under the terms of this contract, interest for late payment shall not exceed one percent (1%) per month.

The firm shall submit invoices on a frequency to be determined, as agreed upon by the City, for each payment requested. Such statement shall also include a detailed breakdown of all charges.

b. Notify the City and Subcontractor, in writing, of his intention to withhold all or a part of the Subcontractor's payment and the reason for non- payment.

57. **Ownership of Documents:** Any reports, specifications, blueprints, negatives or other documents prepared by the Contractor in the performance of its obligations under the resulting contract shall be the exclusive property of City of Suffolk, and all such materials shall be returned to the owner upon completion, termination, or cancellation of this contract. The Contractor shall not use, willingly allow, or cause such materials to be used for any purpose other than performance of all Contractor's obligations under the resulting contract without the prior written consent of City of Suffolk. Documents and materials developed by the Contractor under the resulting contract shall be the property of City or Suffolk; however, the Contractor may retain file copies, which cannot be used without prior written consent of the Owner. City of Suffolk agrees that the Contractor shall not be liable for any damage, loss, or injury resulting from the future use of the provided documents for other than the project specified, when the Contractor is not the firm of record.

58. **Submissions:** All project correspondence, design/review documents, reports, etc. prepared by the Contractor shall be distributed to the City's Project Manager for each task in the format and number of copies as directed by the task statement of work.

Within thirty (30) days of project completion, the Contractor shall prepare and submit a Project Completion Report with project closeout documents and submit to the City's Project Manager

59. **Contractual Disputes:** The Contractor shall give written notice to the Purchasing Agent of his intent to file a claim for money or other relief at the time of the occurrence or the beginning of the work upon which the claim is to be based.

The written claim shall be submitted to the Purchasing Agent no later than sixty (60) days after final payment. If the claim is not disposed of by agreement, the Purchasing Agent shall reduce his decision to writing and mail or otherwise forward a copy thereof to the Contractor within thirty (30) days of receipt of the claim.

The Purchasing Agent's decision shall be final unless the Contractor appeals within thirty (30) days by submitting a written letter of appeal to the City Administrator, or his designee. The City Manager shall render a decision within sixty (60) days of receipt of the appeal.

60. **Responsibility for Making Corrections:** The Consultant shall, without additional costs or fee to the City, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in its performance, The City's review, approval, or acceptance of, nor payment of any of the services required under the contract shall be deemed a waiver of rights by the City as a result of the Engineer's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under the contract.

SECTION 1), SECTIONS 59.1-9.1 THROUGH 59.1-9.17 OR SECTIONS 59.1-68.6 THROUGH 59.1-68.8 OF THE CODE OF VIRGINIA.

THE UNDERSIGNED BIDDER HEREBY CERTIFIES THAT THIS AGREEMENT, OR ANY CLAIMS RESULTING THEREFROM, IS NOT THE RESULT OF, OR AFFECTED BY, ANY ACT OF COLLUSION WITH, OR ANY ACT OF, ANOTHER PERSON OR PERSONS, FIRM OR CORPORATION ENGAGED IN THE SAME LINE OF BUSINESS OR COMMERCE; AND, THAT NO PERSON ACTING FOR, OR EMPLOYED BY, THE CITY OF SUFFOLK HAS AN INTEREST IN, OR IS CONCERNED WITH, THIS BID; AND, THAT NO PERSON OR PERSONS, FIRM OR CORPORATION OTHER THAN THE UNDERSIGNED, HAVE, OR ARE, INTERESTED IN THIS BID.
