3.2 OS&Y Gate Valve – Bid Item No. 36 through Bid Item No. 40

- A. OS&Y gate valve bid items include installing a new gate valve or the replacement of an existing gate valve on an existing or new water main. Valve installation shall be in accordance with HRPDC Regional Construction Standards Section 801. All valves and fittings installed shall have restrained joints. Valve installations shall pass a visual leak test prior to acceptance.
- B. Measurement will be made based on each valve for each size valve installed.
- C. Payment will be made based on the unit cost per each valve installed, complete in place, and satisfactorily tested. Payment will include the cost of the following:
 - 1. Verifying existing pipe size and materials.
 - 2. Cutting and removing existing piping, valves, and fittings, as necessary.
 - 3. Furnishing and installing valve, and sleeves/fittings, as necessary.
 - 4. Coatings.
 - 5. All labor, equipment, and materials necessary for valve installation.
