1.0 PURPOSE

The City of Suffolk is seeking qualified proposals from vendors capable of painting the traffic signal poles and mast-arms at nine intersections in the historic downtown of the City and one in Whaleyville Village on an as-needed basis.

2.0 BACKGROUND

The traffic signals used in the City of Suffolk's historic downtown are custom fluted ornamental galvanized steel poles with black painted finish. There are 10 intersections and one fire station emergency signal (FS1) in the downtown area that use these ornamental poles. There is also a similar ornamental pole for the emergency signal at Fire Station 8 in Whaleyville Village, hereafter referred to as FS8. Over time, the outer surface of these support structures exhibit deterioration from exposure to the natural elements and coming in contact with other objects. Keeping the upright poles and mast arms well painted is not only crucial to maintaining the City's aesthetic appeal, but also provides corrosion protection for these structures which house components that are critical to the proper operation of the City's traffic signals. These traffic signals have been constructed between 1994 and 2013 and are in various states of weathering and deterioration. See example on Page 8.

3.0 COMPETITION INTENDED

It is the City's intent that this Request for Proposal (RFP) permits competition. It shall be the offeror's responsibility to advise the Contract Officer in writing if any language requirement, specification, etc., or any combination thereof, inadvertently restricts or limits the requirements stated in this RFP to a single source. Such notification must be received by the Purchasing Agent not later than five (5) business days prior to the date set for acceptance of proposals.

4.0 TERM OF CONTRACT

The contract shall cover the period from date of award through March 31, 2023.

The City reserves the option to renew this agreement for four (4) additional one-year periods ending March 31, 2027. Unless notified in writing thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date, the contract will automatically renew during these periods.

Initial rates and subsequent renewal rates must be guaranteed for a minimum of twelve (12) months. Any increase in rates shall be limited to the lesser of the Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) – Other Goods and Services (unadjusted for the current 12 month period) or 3%. The City does not guarantee any rate increase. **The City must be notified in advance of any proposed rate increases during the contract period.**

5.0 CONTRACTOR QUALIFICATIONS

Offeror must have a Class "A" Virginia Contractor's license. Offeror must include copies of all licenses and/or certifications with their proposal.

6.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES

Tasks may include, but are not limited to the following:

The exact number of poles to be painted each budget year will be determined by availability of funding and condition of the poles. For the purpose of this RFP, Pedestal Pole refers to a shorter pole that may be between 4 and 10-feet tall, supporting either pedestrian signals or additional traffic signals. The unit price for painting either a Signal Pole, Mast Arm, Pedestal Pole, Signal Head or Pedestrian Signal shall include:

- Surface preparation, including removal of loose paint, algae growth, adhesive residue, etc.
- Priming
- Painting (semi-gloss black)
- Replacing faded signal visors as required.

Contractor Responsibilities

- A. The traffic signal system shall be kept in serviceable and proper working condition.
- B. The Contractor must coordinate with Traffic Engineering if any traffic signal equipment needs to be temporarily relocated to accommodate the work. Any hardware that is broken or damaged during the removal or relocation of City of Suffolk traffic signal equipment shall be replaced with new at no additional cost to the City.
- C. Qualified personnel and adequate equipment sufficient to perform the Work shall be provided at all times.
- D. The contractor shall protect surrounding surfaces.
- E. The contractor shall notify the City within one working day if any of the following is observed:
 - a. Damage caused by vandalism.
 - b. Extensive maintenance items which may affect public safety.
 - c. Maintenance or repair work required to restore traffic signal service.
- F. The contractor shall provide for proper traffic control in accordance with standards established by the Virginia Department of Transportation in the Work Area Protection Manual.
- G. The contractor shall advise the City of any maintenance or repair work which in the opinion of the contractor is necessary for proper and safe operations.

The City reserves the right to add or delete locations.

Employees

If any person employed on the job by the Contractor shall appear to the City's Contract Manager to be incompetent or to act in a disorderly or improper manner, such person shall be removed immediately on request of the City, and shall not again be re-employed on the same project except on written consent by the City.

All employees of the Contractor shall have proper identification from their company.

Procedures

The extent and character of the services to be performed by the contractor shall be subject to the general control and approval of the Contract Manager or his authorized representative(s). Any change to this agreement must be approved in writing by the City's Purchasing Agent and Contract Manager.

Work is expected to be performed by the Contractor. If subcontractors are needed, the Contractor must have prior approval from the City before using any subcontractors.

The City reserves the right to purchase additional related services on an as-needed basis for during the term of the contract, not to exceed \$50,000 per year. For each additional service proposed by the City, the Offeror shall provide a written description of the services to be provided. Fees and schedules for additional projects shall be subject to negotiation; if mutually acceptable terms are not achieved, the City reserves the right to obtain the necessary services from other sources.



7.0 INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING PROPOSALS

A. Submission of Proposals

An electronic document shall be submitted by e-mail attachment to proposals@suffolkva.us with the RFP number, title, and closing date in the subject line. Electronic copies may be delivered to the Purchasing Office, 442 West Washington Street, Room 1086, Suffolk, Virginia prior to the closure date shown, if desired. Documents should be saved as a .pdf document and should conserve disk space to allow transfers of data. **ZIP files cannot be accepted**; they do not work in the City's system. To receive confirmation of receipt of proposal, send request to the contracting officer at jallison@suffolkva.us. Do **NOT** send proposal directly to contracting officer.

Offerors so selected maybe required to make a formal presentation of their qualifications and job approach, and may be selected for final negotiations of contract. Therefore, care should be given to address the issues relating to the criteria to follow. Read the entire solicitation before submitting a proposal. Failure to read any part of this RFP shall not relieve any offeror from his or her contractual obligations.

B. Questions and Inquiries

Questions and inquiries pertaining to the Request for Proposals will be accepted from any and all firms via e-mail to jallison@suffolkva.us or fax. Inquires must provide RFP number, title and acceptance date. Material questions will be answered by Addendum and will be posted on the City's website:

http://apps.suffolkva.us/bids/bid_search_all.jsp and to all firms who receive the RFP provided that all questions are received five business (5) days prior to opening date.

Julie Allison, Buyer, is the designated authorized spokesperson for the City of Suffolk with respect to this RFP. All questions and/or comments should be directed to her attention. The respondents to this RFP shall not contact, either directly or indirectly, any other employee or agent of the City regarding this RFP. This prohibition shall also extend to the Suffolk City Council and other elected City officials. Any such unauthorized contact may disqualify the offeror from the procurement.

C. Addendum and Supplement to Request

If it becomes necessary to revise any part of this request or if additional data are necessary to enable an exact interpretation of provisions of this request, an addendum will be issued. It is the responsibility of the offeror to ensure that he has received all addendums prior to submitting a proposal. D. Firm Pricing for City Acceptance

Offers made during negotiation must be honored for City acceptance for 180 days from the date of offer.

E. Proprietary Information

Trade secrets or proprietary information submitted by an offeror in connection with this solicitation shall not be subject to disclosure under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act; however, the offeror must invoke the protections of this section prior to or upon submission of the data or other materials, and must clearly identify the data or other materials to be protected and state the reasons why protection is necessary. Offerors shall not mark sections of their proposal as proprietary if they are to be part of the award of the contract and are of a "Material" nature. Any propriety information must be listed on the attached "Proprietary/confidential Information Identification" form and submitted with the proposal. An all-inclusive statement that the entire proposal is proprietary will result in rejection of the proposal.

F. Authority to Bind Firm in Contract

Proposals must give full firm name and address of offeror. Failure to sign proposal may disqualify it. Person signing proposal should show title or authority to bind his firm in a contract. Firm name and authorized signature must appear on proposal in the space provided on the pricing page.

G. Preparation and Submission of Proposals

1. All proposals shall be signed by the individual or authorized principals of the firm.
2. All attachments to the Request for Proposal requiring executing by the firm are to be returned with the proposals.
3. Proposals are to be submitted electronically; subject line should indicate the RFP number and the title of the proposal.
4. It is the Offeror's responsibility that the proposals are received by the Purchasing Division BEFORE the hour specified on the opening date. Requests for extensions of this time and date will not be granted. Proposals or unsolicited amendments to proposals received by the City after the acceptance date will not be considered.

H. Miscellaneous Requirements

1. The City will not be responsible for any expenses incurred by a firm in preparing and submitting a proposal. All proposals shall provide a straightforward, concise delineation of the firm's capabilities to satisfy the requirements of this request. Emphasis should be on completeness and clarity of content.
2. Offerors who submit a proposal in response to this RFP may be required to make an oral presentation of their proposal. The Purchasing Division will schedule the time and location for this presentation.
3. The contents of the proposal submitted by the successful offeror and this RFP will become part of any contract awarded as a result of the Scope of Services

contained herein. The successful firm will be expected to sign a contract with the City.

4. The City reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received by reason of this request, or to negotiate separately in any manner necessary to serve the best interests of the City.

8.0 SPECIFIC PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

Proposals should be as thorough and detailed as necessary to allow the City of Suffolk to properly evaluate the offeror's capabilities to provide the required services. Offerors are required to submit the following items in the format provided as a complete proposal.

The City reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted and to request additional information if deemed necessary.

A. Cover Letter

The offeror will complete and submit the signed Cover Sheet (Page 1) and submit it with a brief cover letter. The cover letter should summarize key elements of the proposal. An individual authorized to bind Offeror must sign the letter and Signature Sheet, as well. Indicate the address and telephone number of the Contractor's office.

B. Background and Project Summary Section

This section should describe your understanding of the City, the work to be performed, and the objectives to be accomplished. Refer to the "Scope of Services" Section of this RFP.

C. Methodology Section

Provide a detailed description of the approach and methodology to be used to accomplish the "Scope of Services" of this RFP. The Methodology Section should include the following:

1. Detailed description of efforts your firm will undertake to achieve client satisfaction and to satisfy the requirements of the "Scope of Services" Section.
2. Detailed description of specific tasks you will require from City staff. Explain what the respective roles of City staff and your staff would be to complete the tasks specified herein.
3. A description of means and methods to be employed in preparing the surfaces for painting
4. Specifications for the primer and top coat to be used.

D. Staffing Section

Provide a list of key individual(s) who will be working on this contract and indicate the title of each, and the function that each will perform. Include a resume for each designated individual, to include licenses, certifications, and other qualifications. Licenses and/or certifications should be included in proposal.

E. Qualifications

The information requested in this section should describe the qualifications of the firm, and any subcontractors, in performing contracts within the past five (5) years that are similar in size and scope to that requested in the RFP. Information shall include the following:

1. Length of time that the firm has provided the services being requested herein.
2. Furnish a list of a minimum of five (5) projects/contracts similar to the size and scope of this RFP. Information shall include:
 - Client name
 - Project/contract description.
 - Project/contract start and end dates
 - Client project manager name, email, and telephone number

F. Format

Proposal should be submitted in the following format:

- Cover Sheet and Cover Letter
- Proposal sequenced in accordance with Paragraphs B-E above
- City Forms as follows: (All forms must be signed.)

9.0 EVALUATION AND AWARD CRITERIA

The City's Evaluation Committee shall review each proposal and verify the claims and credentials of each offeror. Selection will be made for each proposal on the basis of the criteria listed below. Each criteria will be evaluated based upon the strengths and weaknesses of the submittal or subsequent information gained in the process.

- Qualifications, credentials and resources (20%)
- Experience in contracts with similar scope, complexity, and magnitude for other organizations (30%)
- Fee proposal for proposed work plan (50%)

Once each member of the Evaluation Committee has read and rated each proposal by use of the criteria, a consensus of the Committee shall be used established ranking the proposals. This ranking shall be used to select the firms for further consideration—the short-list. At this point, the Evaluation Committee will conduct interviews with two or more of the top ranked firms.

The successful firm will be expected to enter into a contract with the City of Suffolk based upon their submittal, any additional negotiated terms, and best and final pricing. The successful firm shall execute and return the contract documents to the City within ten business (10) days of receipt.

10.0 ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Use of Form:** All proposals should be submitted in electronic (.pdf) format in accordance with this form. The offeror may attach/scan other information as required to the electronic document that will be made a part of the proposal. Electronic submittals on CD, DVD, flash drives, or other electronic media will be accepted if delivered prior to the closing time. The preferred method is by an attachment to an email addressed to: proposals@suffolkva.us. ZIP files cannot be accepted.
2. **Submittals:** Except as noted above, all proposals shall be sent as an attachment to email to: proposals@suffolkva.us. The subject line must show the proposal number and title.
3. **Late Proposals:** Proposals, if received by the City's Purchasing Division ("Purchasing") after the date and time specified, will not be considered. It will be the responsibility of the offeror to see that their proposal is received by Purchasing as specified. There will be no exceptions. Electronic proposals show the date and time sent. This must be prior to the closing date published on the front cover.
4. **City Hall Closure:** Should the City's electronic networks connectivity prevent receipt of proposals at the time of the scheduled proposal closing, the proposals will be accepted and opened on the next business day of the City, at the original scheduled hour, or as soon as connectivity is restored during normal business hours.
5. **Competition Intended:** It is the City's intent that this RFP permits competition. It shall be the offeror's responsibility to advise the Contract Officer in writing if any language requirement, specification, terms, conditions, or any combination thereof, inadvertently restricts or limits the requirements stated in this RFP to a single source. Such notification must be received by the Contract Officer prior to the date set for proposals to close.
6. **Contract Quantities:** The quantities specified in the RFP are estimates only unless otherwise clearly noted, and are given for the information of Offeror and for the purpose of proposal evaluation. They do not indicate the actual quantity that will be required, since such volume will depend upon requirements that may develop during the contract period. Quantities shown shall not be construed to represent any amount which the City shall be obligated to purchase under the contract, or relieve the offeror of his obligation to fill all orders placed by the City, except as clearly noted.

7. **Delivery:** The time of delivery of services must be stated in definite terms. If time of delivery for services varies, the offeror shall so state.
8. **Offeror's Qualifications:** Only proposals from established offerors for work similar in scope to work herein shall be considered; the City reserves the right to request specific reference information prior to award. Offeror shall demonstrate that they have adequate and appropriate manpower, and resourced to respond and perform in accordance with the provisions herein.

The City may, at its option, disqualify an offeror and reject its proposal for cause. Reasons deemed to be sufficient for this action shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Evidence of collusion among offerors.
 - Receipt of more than one proposal on any project from an individual, or from a corporation. This restriction does not apply to sub-Contractors
 - Default on any previous contract.
 - For unreasonable failure to complete a previous contract within the specified time or for being in arrears on an existing contract without reasonable cause for being in arrears.
 - Inability to perform as revealed by an investigation of the offeror's financial statement, experience and/or plant and equipment.
 - Offeror does not meet project-specific requirements, as identified in the solicitation.
9. **Pricing to be F.O.B. Destination – Freight Allowed:** Pricing shall be F.O.B. destination-freight included for all competitive proposals. F.O.B. Destination-Freight Included shall include all shipping costs to the City location(s) at the unit cost. No additional shipping charges shall be allowed.
 10. **Samples:** Samples, when requested, must be furnished free of expense, and upon request, if not destroyed, will be returned at the offeror's risk and expense.
 11. **Silence of Specifications:** The apparent silence of these specifications and any supplemental specifications as to any detail or the omission from the specifications of a detailed description concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail and correct type, size and design are to be used. All interpretations of these specifications shall be made on the basis of this statement.
 12. **Capacity of Offeror:** All proposals must be signed by a responsible officer or employee having the authority to bind the firm in contract. The offeror agrees that its contract performance shall be in strict conformance with the contract documents.
 13. **Rights to Damages:** By signing its proposal, the offeror assigns to the City any and all rights that it may have under the antitrust laws of the United States and the Commonwealth of Virginia in any way arising from or pertaining to this proposal. This provision is remedial in nature and is to be liberally construed by any court in favor of the City.

14. **Anti-collusion**: The offeror certifies by signing its proposal that the proposal is made without prior understanding, agreement, or accord with any other person or firm submitting a proposal for the same goods and/or services and the this proposal is in all respects bona fide, fair, and not the result of any act of fraud or collusion with another person or firm engaged in the same line of business or commerce. Any false statement hereunder may constitute a felony and can result in a fine and imprisonment, as well as civil damages. Should sub-Contractors have interest in multiple submittals, this clause does not apply except when an act of collusion or fraud has occurred.

15. **Contact Prohibition**: Direct contact with City departments other than Purchasing, on the subject of this proposal is expressly forbidden except with the foreknowledge and permission of the Contract Officer. Violation may result in a determination that your firm is ineligible for an award.

All questions shall be in writing to the Contract Officer shown on the title page of the proposal. The respondents to this RFP shall not contact, either directly or indirectly, any other employee or agent of the City regarding this RFP. This prohibition shall also extend to the Suffolk City Council and locally elected officials. Any such unauthorized contact may disqualify the offeror from this procurement.

16. **Debarment Status**: By submitting a proposal, offerors certify that they are not currently debarred by the Commonwealth of Virginia from submitting proposals or proposals on contracts for the type of goods and/or services covered by this solicitation, nor are they an agent of any person or entity that is currently so debarred.

17. **Ethics in Procurement**: Offeror must provide written disclosure with their proposal if one of its officers, directors, trustees, partners, employees, or lenders is an employee or officer of the City of Suffolk or an immediate family member of the employee or officer (as defined by Section 2.2-4368 of the Virginia Procurement Act) who is involved personally or substantially participates in procurement transactions or owns or controls an interest of more than three percent (3%) of the company or receives more than \$5,000 annually from the Offeror.

18. **Addenda**: If issued, addenda to this solicitation will be posted on the Purchasing website (<http://www.suffolkva.us/bids/>). It is the offeror's responsibility to check the website or contact the Purchasing Division prior to the submittal deadline to ensure that the Offeror has a complete, up-to-date package. Acknowledgement of all issued Addenda shall be indicated in the proposal.

19. **Withdrawal of Proposals**: Proposals may be withdrawn (cancelled) any time prior to the closing time and date. Withdrawal of proposals may be accomplished by submitting such request in writing on the issuing company's letterhead either by email, in person, or by certified mail.

20. **Award**: Award will be made to the offeror considered by the City's sole determination after following the procedure outlined herein. The process used for this solicitation shall be Competitive Negotiation for as outlined in the Virginia Public Procurement Act.

21. **Announcements**: Upon the award or the announcement of the decision to award a contract, the City will publicly post such notice on the electronic bulletin board located outside of the Purchasing Division and on the Purchasing web site:

22. **Offer/Acceptance:** Each proposal is received with the understanding that the acceptance in writing by the City of the offer to furnish any or all of the goods and/or services described therein, shall constitute a contract between the Offeror and the City, which shall bind the offeror to furnish and deliver the goods and/or services quoted at the prices stated and in accordance with the conditions of the accepted proposal; and the City on its part to order from such offeror, except for causes beyond reasonable control; and pay for, at the agreed prices, all goods and/or services specified and delivered.
23. **City's Rights:** The City reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, and to waive any informality if it is determined to be in the best interest of the City.
24. **Appeals Procedure:** Upon offeror's request, administrative appeals information will be provided that shall be used for hearing protests of a decision to award, or an award, appeals from refusal to allow withdrawal of proposals, appeals from disqualification, appeals for debarment or suspension, or determination of non-responsibility and appeals from decisions or disputes arising during the performance of a contract. To be timely all appeals shall be made within the time periods set forth by the Virginia Public Procurement Act, §2.2-4357, *et seq.* Contact the Contract Officer at once for assistance.
25. **Additional Conditions:** The Contract Terms and Conditions and all Instructions in this solicitation are intended to apply to the resulting contract and shall supersede any conflicting terms in the Offeror's proposal. Any additional conditions an offeror intends be considered must be submitted with the proposal and noted as an exception. Such exceptions may result in a finding that the submittal is 'non-responsive' to the proposal, negating possibility of an award to that offeror. Contractual documents submitted by the successful firm after an award will not be accepted.

11.0 CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. **Conflict:** In the event of a conflict between the contract documents, including these Contract Terms and Conditions, the final executed contract documents shall control.
2. **Alien employment:** Contractor certifies that he does not and shall not during the performance of the contract for goods and services in the Commonwealth, knowingly employ unauthorized aliens as defined in the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as amended.
3. **Anti-Discrimination:** The Contractor certifies to the City that they will conform to the provisions of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Contracting Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable, the Virginians with Disabilities Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act and §2.2-4311 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act (VPPA). If the award is made to a faith-based organization, the organization shall not discriminate against any recipient of goods, services, or disbursements made pursuant to the contract on the basis of the recipient's religion, religious belief, refusal to participate in a religious practice, or on the basis of

race, age, color, gender or national origin and shall be subject to the same rules as other organizations that contract with public bodies to account for the use of the funds provided; however, if the faith-based organization segregates public funds into separate accounts, only the accounts and programs funded with public funds shall be subject to audit by the public body. (Code of Virginia 2.2.4343.1E).

The following provisions apply to all contracts over \$10,000:

1. During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:
 - a. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, service disabled veterans or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment, except where there is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the Contractor. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - b. The Contractor, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, will state that such Contractor is an equal opportunity employer.
 - c. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting these requirements.
2. The Contractor will include the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs a, b, and c above in every subcontract or purchase order over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.
4. **Assignment of Contract:** A contract shall not be assignable by the Contractor in whole or in part without the written consent of the City.
5. **Availability of Funds:** A contract shall be deemed in force only to the extent of appropriations available to each department for the purchase of such goods and/or services. The City's extended obligations on those contracts that envision extended funding through successive fiscal periods shall be contingent upon actual appropriations for the following years.
6. **Changes and Additions:** It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to notify the City, in writing, of any necessary modifications or additions in the Scope of the contract. Compensation for changes or additions in the Scope of the contract will be negotiated and approved by the City, in writing.

It is understood and agreed to by both the City and the Contractor that such modifications or additions to the contract shall be made only by the full execution of the City's standard Contract change order form. Furthermore, it is understood and agreed by both parties that any work done by the Contractor on such modification or addition to the contract prior to the City's execution of its standard Contract change order form shall be at the total risk of the Contractor and said work may not be compensated by

the City.

7. **Conflicts of Interests:** The Contractor shall not accept or receive commissions or other payments from third parties for soliciting, negotiating, procuring, or effecting insurance on behalf of the City. The City may not procure supplies, equipment, materials or other goods from a Contractor on the same project.
8. **Contractor's Failure to Perform:** Failure of the Contractor to perform the contract by reason of the City's non-acceptance of additional conditions submitted after the award shall result in termination of the contract by the City, and may result in debarment of the Contractor for a period of up to three (3) years. Termination and /or debarment of the Contractor shall not constitute a waiver by the City of any other rights or remedies available to the City by law or contract.
9. **Contractual Disputes:** Bidder, Offeror, Contractor or Contractor agree all contractual disputes will be conducted in accordance with provision §2.2-4363 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act.
10. **Copyright Protection:** Contractor agrees to defend and save the City, its agents, officials, and employees, harmless from liability of any nature or kind, for use of any copyright, composition, secret process, patented or unpatented invention, articles or appliances furnished or used in the performance of the contract, or which Contractor is not the patentee, assignee, or licensee, to the same extent as provided in the above paragraph.
11. **Default:** In event of default by Contractor, the City reserves the right to procure the goods and/or services from other sources, and hold Contractor liable for any excess cost occasioned thereby. Such actions taken by the City shall not release the Contractor from additional remedies that may be allowed by law.
12. **Drug-Free Workplace:** During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees to (1) provide a drug-free workplace for the Contractor's employees; (2) post in conspicuous place, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the Contractor's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (3) state in all solicitation or advertisement for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor that the Contractor maintains a drug-free workplace; and (4) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each sub-Contractor or vendor.

For the purposes of this section, "drug-free workplace" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a Contractor, the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of any controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the contract.

13. **Entire Agreement:** This contract and any additional or supplementary documents incorporated herein by reference contain all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties hereto, and no other agreements, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject

matter of this contract or any part thereof shall have any validity or bind any of the parties hereto. The contract shall not be modified, altered, changed or amended unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

14. **Exemption from Taxes**: The City is exempt from state sales tax and federal excise tax. A tax exemption certificate indicating the City's tax exempt status will be furnished by the City upon request.
15. **Faith-based Organizations**: The City of Suffolk does not discriminate against faith-based organizations.
16. **Governing Law**: This contract shall be made, entered into, and shall be performed in the City of Suffolk, Virginia, and shall be governed by the applicable laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia without regard to its conflict of law rules. In the event of litigation concerning this the contract, the parties agree to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Circuit Court of the City of Suffolk, Virginia; however, in the event that the federal court has jurisdiction over the matter, then the parties agree to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Norfolk Division.

The Contractor shall not cause a delay in services because of pending litigation or during litigation proceedings, except with the express, written consent of the City or written instruction/order from the Court.

17. **Indemnification**: Contractor shall defend and indemnify the City, and the City's employees, agents, and volunteers, from and against any and all damage claim, liability, cost, or expense (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and court costs) of every kind and nature (including, without limitation, those arising from any injury or damage to any person, property or business) incurred by or claimed against Contractor, its employees, agents, and volunteers, or incurred by or claimed against the City, the City's employees, agents, and volunteers, arising out of, or in connection with, the performance of all services hereunder by Contractor. This indemnification includes, but is not limited to, any financial or other loss, including, but not limited to, any adverse regulatory, agency or administrative sanction or civil penalties, incurred by the City due to the negligent, fraudulent or criminal acts of Contractor or any of the Contractor's officers, shareholders, employees, agents, Contractors, sub-Contractors, or any other person or entity acting on behalf of Contractor. Unless otherwise provided by law, the Contractor indemnification obligations hereunder shall not be limited in any way by the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for Contractor under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, other employee benefit acts, or benefits payable under any insurance policy. This paragraph shall survive the termination of the contract including any renewal or extension thereof.
18. **Independent Contractor**: The Contractor and any employees, agents, or other persons or entities acting on behalf of the Contractor shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers, employees, or agents of the City.
19. **Insurance**: Contractor shall procure, maintain, and provide proof of insurance coverage for injuries to persons and property damage as may arise from or in conjunction with the work performed on behalf of the City by the Contractor, his agents, representatives, employees or subcontractors. Proof of coverage as contained herein

shall consist of all policies, endorsements, declaration pages, and certificates of insurance and shall be submitted fifteen (15) days prior to the commencement of work, and such coverage shall be maintained by the Contractor for the duration of the contract period; for occurrence policies. Claims made policies must extend reporting period for two (2) years after expiration date.

a. General Liability

Coverage shall be as broad as: Comprehensive General Liability endorsed to include Broad Form, Commercial General Liability Form including Products/Completed Operations.

c. Workers' Compensation

Limits as required by the Workers' Compensation Act of Virginia. Employers Liability, \$100,000/\$500,000/\$100,000

d. Umbrella/Excess Liability

\$2,000,000 umbrella/excess liability coverage

e. Coverage Provisions

1. All deductibles or self-insured retention shall appear on the certificate(s).
2. The City of Suffolk, its officers, officials, employees, agents and volunteers shall be added as "additional insured" as their interests may appear. This provision does not apply to Professional Liability or Workers' Compensation/Employers' Liability.
3. The Contractor's insurance shall be primary over any applicable insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City.

4. Shall provide 30 days' written notice to the City before any cancellation, suspension, or void of coverage in whole or part, where such provision is reasonable.
5. All coverage for subcontractors of the Contractor shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.
6. Failure to comply with any reporting provisions of the policy(s) shall not affect coverage provided the City, its officers/officials, agents, employees and volunteers.
7. The insurer shall agree to waive all rights of subrogation against the City, its' officers/officials, agents, employees or volunteers for any act, omission or condition of premises which the parties may be held liable by reason of negligence.
8. The Contractor shall furnish the City certificates of insurance including endorsements affecting coverage. The certificates are to be signed by a person authorized by the insurance company(s) to bind coverage on its behalf, if executed by a broker, notarized copy of authorization to bind, or certify coverage must be attached.
9. All insurance shall be placed with insurers maintaining an A.M. Best rating of no less than an A:VII. If A.M. Best rating is less than A:VII, approval must be received from City's Risk Officer.

All coverage designated herein shall be as broad as the Insurance Services Office (ISO) forms filed for use with the Commonwealth of Virginia.

20. **Invoicing/Payment and Interest:** Prior to payment the Contractor shall provide their federal employer identification number. Payment to the Contractor shall be made not more than forty-five (45) days after goods or services are received; or not more the forty-five (45) days after the invoice is rendered, whichever is later.

Unless otherwise provided under the terms of this contract, interest for late payment shall not exceed one percent (1%) per month.

The Contractor shall submit invoices on a frequency to be determined, as agreed upon by the City, for each payment requested. Such statement shall also include a detailed breakdown of all charges.

All such invoices will be paid promptly unless any items thereon are questioned, in which event payment will be withheld pending verification of the amount claimed and the validity of the claim. The Contractor shall provide complete cooperation during any such investigation.

21. **Laws, Regulations:** Contractor shall keep fully informed of all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances and regulations that in any manner affect the conduct of the work. Contractor shall at all times observe and comply with all such laws, ordinances and regulations.

22. **License Requirement:** All firms doing business in the City are required to be licensed in accordance with the City of Suffolk business license ordinance. Wholesale and retail merchants without a business location in the City of Suffolk are exempt from this requirement. Any questions concerning business licenses should be directed to the Commissioner of the Revenue's Office, telephone (757) 514-4260 or comrev@suffolkva.us.
23. **Ownership of Documents:** Any data generated, reports, specifications, blueprints, negatives or other documents prepared by the Contractor in the performance of its obligations under the resulting contract shall be the exclusive property of City of Suffolk, and all such materials shall be returned to the owner upon completion, termination, or cancellation of this contract. The Contractor shall not use, willingly allow, or cause such materials to be used for any purpose other than performance of all Contractor's obligations under the resulting contract without the prior written consent of City of Suffolk. Documents and materials developed by the Contractor under the resulting contract shall be the property of City or Suffolk; however, the Contractor may retain file copies, which cannot be used without prior written consent of the Owner. City of Suffolk agrees that the Contractor shall not be liable for any damage, loss, or injury resulting from the future use of the provided documents for other than the project specified, when the Contractor is not the firm of record.
24. **Payments to Subcontractors:** Within seven (7) days after receipt of amounts paid by the City for work performed by a subcontractor under this contract, the Contractor shall either:
- a. Pay the Subcontractor for the proportionate share of the total payment received from the City attributable to the work performed by the Subcontractor under this contract; or
 - b. Notify the City and Subcontractor, in writing, of his intention to withhold all or a part of the Subcontractor's payment and the reason for non- payment.

The Contractor shall pay interest to the Subcontractor on all amounts owed that remain unpaid beyond the seven-day period except for amounts withheld as allowed in item b. above.

Unless otherwise provided under the terms of this contract, interest shall accrue at the rate of one percent per month.

The Contractor shall include in each of its subcontracts a provision requiring each Subcontractor to include or otherwise be subject to the same payment and interest requirements as set forth above with respect to each lower-tier subcontractor.

The Contractor's obligation to pay an interest charge to a subcontractor pursuant to this provision may not be construed to be an obligation of the City.

25. **Records and Inspection:** The Contractor shall maintain full and accurate records with respect to all matters covered under this contract, including, without limitation, accounting records, written policies, procedures, time records, telephone records, and any other supporting evidence used to memorialize, reflect, and substantiate charges or fees related to this contract. The Contractor's records shall be open to inspection

and subject to audit and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by the City and its employees, agents or authorized representatives after giving at least three (3) days' notice to the Contractor by the City. The City shall have access to such records from the effective date of this contract, for the duration of the contract, and for five (5) years after the date of final payment by the City to the Contractor pursuant to this contract or any renewal or extension of this contract. The City's employees, agents or authorized representatives shall have access to the Contractor's facilities, shall have access to all necessary records and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space, in order to conduct audits. All records and information generated under the contract shall be property of the City, whether retained by the City or the Contractor. The Contractor shall not make any other use of this information, except to provide service to the City under the contract, unless specifically authorized by the City in writing.

26. **Responsibility of Contractor:** The Contractor shall, without additional costs or fee to the City, correct or revise any errors or deficiencies in his performance. Neither the City's review, approval or acceptance of, nor payment for any of the services required under this Contract shall be deemed a waiver of rights by the City, and the Contractor shall remain liable to the City for all costs which are incurred by the City as a result of the Contractor's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under the contract.
27. **Rights and Remedies Not Waived:** In no event shall the making by the City of any payment to the Contractor, or the waiver by the City of any provision under this contract including any obligation of the Contractor, constitute or be construed as a waiver by the City of any other provision, obligation, breach of covenant, or any default which may exist under this contract on the part of the Contractor, and the making of any such payment by the City while any such breach or default exists shall not impair or prejudice any right or remedies available to the City.
28. **Safety:** All Contractors and sub-contractors performing services for the City are required and shall comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), State and City Safety and Occupational Health Standards and any other applicable rules and regulations. Also all Contractors and sub-Contractors shall be held responsible for the safety of their employees and any unsafe acts or conditions that may cause injury or damage to any persons or property within and around the work site area under this contract.
29. **Scheduling and Delays:** The parties to any contract resultant of this solicitation acknowledge that all or part of the work to be performed hereunder may be delayed and extended at the option of the City. Such delays may be caused by delays, denials and modifications of the various state or federal permits, or for other reasons. The City shall not be required to pay any of the Contractor's direct or indirect costs, or claims for compensation, extended overhead, or other damage or consequential damages arising out of or related to any delays or interruptions required or ordered by the City. If the City delays a task order for any reason for a continuous period of ninety (90) days or more, the City and Contractor will negotiate a mutually agreeable adjustment to the Contractor's fee.
30. **Severability:** If any provision of the contract or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall to any extent be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the contract, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than

those which it is invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected hereby, and each provision of the contract shall be valid and enforced to the full extent permitted by law.

31. **Submissions:** All project correspondence, design/review documents, reports, etc. prepared by the Contractor shall be distributed to the City's Project Manager for each task in the format and number of copies as directed by the task statement of work.
32. **Termination for Cause:** In the event that the Contractor shall for any reason or through any cause be in default of the terms of this contract, the City may give Contractor written notice of such default by certified mail/return receipt requested at the address set forth in Contractor's Proposal/ or as provided in this contract.

Unless otherwise provided, Contractor shall have ten (10) days from the date such notice is mailed in which to cure the default. Upon failure of Contractor to cure the default, the City may immediately cancel and terminate this contract as of the mailing date of the default notice.

Upon termination, Contractor shall withdraw its personnel and equipment, cease performance of any further work under the contract, and turn over to the City any work in process for which payment has been made. In the event of violations of law, safety or health standards and regulations, this contract may be immediately cancelled and terminated by the City and provisions herein with respect to opportunity to cure default shall not be applicable.

33. **Termination for Convenience:** The City may at any time, and for any reason, terminate this contract by written notice to the Contractor specifying the termination date, which shall be not less than thirty (30) days from the date such notice is mailed.

Notice shall be given to Contractor by certified mail/return receipt requested at the address set forth in Contractor's Proposal or as provided in this contract. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall be paid such amount as shall compensate the Contractor for the work satisfactorily completed, and accepted by the City, at the time of termination. If the City terminates this Contractor, Contractor shall withdraw its personnel and equipment, cease performance of any further work under this Contractor, and turn over to the City any work completed or in process for which payment has been made.

34. **COVID-19 Procedures:** All Contractors and sub-contractors performing services for the City are required and shall comply with all policies and procedures for COVID-19 from the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), Virginia Department of Health (VDH) and Center for Disease Control (CDC) and all other City and State rules and regulations. Contractor's employees who are known or suspected to be infected with SARS-CoV-2 virus shall not report to or remain at the worksite until cleared to return to work. Contractor shall report if an employee who is positive for COVID-19 has been at the worksite to the Department in which they are working for immediately. Contractor shall keep confidential the identity of the known to be infected with SARS-CoV-2 virus in accordance with the requirements of the Americans, with Disabilities Act (ADA) HIPAA, and other applicable federal and Virginia laws and regulations.

 - C. NOTICES, ADVERTISEMENTS, AND SOLICITATIONS PLACED IN ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL LAW, RULE OR REGULATION SHALL BE DEEMED SUFFICIENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
 - D. BIDDER WILL INCLUDE THE PROVISIONS OF THE FOREGOING SECTIONS A, B, AND C IN EVERY SUBCONTRACT OR PURCHASE ORDER OF OVER \$10,000, SO THAT THE PROVISIONS WILL BE BINDING UPON EACH SUBCONTRACTOR OR VENDOR.
